



Advanced Practice Clinician Fellowship

Who is eligible?

Any nurse practitioner or physician assistant within 18 months after graduation from a nurse practitioner or physician assistant program may apply for the North Mississippi Medical Center Advanced Practice Clinician (APC) Fellowship. The focus is on family/primary care.

When does the Fellowship start?

The Fellowship runs Oct. 1-Sept. 30 each year.

What type things will I be doing? How is it different from a regular APC job?

The Fellowship is a blended program with both inpatient hospital and outpatient clinic rotations. The Fellowship allows for direct supervision for the 720 hours mandated by the Mississippi Board of Nursing for nurse practitioners and assistance for physician assistants in scheduling and completing the 120 days of direct supervision required by the Mississippi Board of Medicine.

Participation in this fellowship by NPs and PAs assists you in completing paperwork for NPI, PMP, DEA and third-party payor credentialing, and provides additional clinical experience in a variety of settings. Continuing education is provided for such skills as suturing, radiology, rural trauma, DOT exams, SANE and other programs to verify and document competency. Specialty and primary care rotations may include rotations in cardiology, endocrinology, infectious disease, behavioral health, urology, rheumatology, emergency services, skilled nursing facilities and tobacco cessation.

Rotations are determined based on skill needs and personal electives. The Fellowship is different from a regular APC job in that you have a seasoned APC with you throughout all of the clinical rotations. The goal is to allow you adequate time to learn about North Mississippi Health Services' clinics and hospitals.

Job Description & Benefits

During the Fellowship, you are considered a full-time regular salaried employee with full benefits. At the conclusion of the Fellowship, you are welcome to apply for open positions within NMHS.
